



Admission requirements for Bachelor theses

Students who are interested in writing their Bachelor thesis at the chair have to meet the following requirements.

- Lecture “Statistics” (assessment year)
- Lecture “Introductory Econometrics”
- Lecture “Introduction to Scientific Working”
- Lecture “Business Administration III”
- (From FS26) Lecture “Impact evaluation for business economists”
- Experience and documented interest (selected empirical seminars) in our topics
- Some experience with common software packages for data analysis such as Stata.

It is expected that Bachelor students who write their thesis at the chair have excellent theoretical knowledge in statistics and econometrics and some experience with common software packages for data analysis such as Stata.

Please note the following:

- **It is only possible to write empirical Bachelor thesis**
- **The thesis must be written in English**
- **The chair has only limited capacity.** Students who have access to a unique data set (e.g., HR data from their workplace) or have a *realistic plan* to collect their own data (e.g., by using surveys/experiments or scraping social media data) will have priority.
- The broad topics are: gender, skill acquisition, incentives, crime.
It is expected that students develop their own ideas for the thesis within the scope of these topics.
- You can only start working on the thesis after it is confirmed that you have the data.

Application process

Please submit your application via the thesis market.

Please make sure that your application contain a clear description of the data that you want to use. In case you want to collect the data yourself, please explain how you would do that *in practice*.
